## *Overview of MARRC*

The Manitoba Association for Resource Recovery Corp. (MARRC) is a non-profit corporation established in 1997 by manufacturers and marketers of lubricating products in Manitoba. Its mandate is to develop, implement and administer a cost-effective, sustainable, user-financed, province-wide stewardship program for used oil, used oil filters and used oil containers.

MARRC was incorporated under The Corporations Act of Manitoba on April 1, 1997. It operates in accordance with a Letter of Approval issued by Manitoba Environment on February 26, 1998 under Section 7 of the “Used Oil, Oil Filters and Containers Stewardship Regulation” of the Waste Reduction and Prevention Act.

Further to earlier approvals of 5 year terms, MARRC received a letter of approval dated September 25, 2013, from the Minister of Conservation extending the Stewardship Plan term for an additional five years to December 15, 2017.

On May 1, 2011 the Corporation was also approved to operate the Used Antifreeze Stewardship Program by the Minister of Conservation. The Used Antifreeze Stewardship Program commenced operation August 1, 2011. The approval from the Minister of Conservation expires December 31, 2016. On October 22, 2015, the Minister approved an extension to the “Condition of Approval”. This approval shall now expire on December 15, 2017 (See letter on opposite page).

The Corporation derives revenue principally in the form of Environmental Handling Charges (EHCs) applied to the sale or consumption of selected lubricating and antifreeze products in Manitoba. The Corporation’s primary expenses are related to the:

- establishment and operation of a publicly-accessible network of licensed collection facilities for used lubricating and antifreeze products,
- payment of Return Incentives to companies licensed by the province and registered with MARRC to collect used lubricating and antifreeze products and transfer them to approved processors and end-users,
- payment of Processing Incentives to companies licensed by the province and registered with MARRC to recycle used lubricating and antifreeze products, and
- development and distribution of public education materials.

MARRC’s affairs are managed by a six-person Board of Directors drawn from the member companies of MARRC and from other stakeholder organizations, including a Director representing the Antifreeze industry.

Thank you for your letter dated September 25, 2015 regarding extension to the approval of the Antifreeze Stewardship Program of the Manitoba Association for Resource Recovery Corp. (MARRC) under *The Waste Reduction and Prevention Act (WRAP Act)*.

I am hereby providing an extension to the "Conditions of Approval" as identified in your Letter of Approval, dated April 14, 2011. All other terms and conditions will remain in force without change. Furthermore, pursuant to Section 7(4) of the *Household Hazardous Material and Prescribed Material Stewardship Regulation*, this approval shall expire on December 15, 2017. In accordance with this extension, please submit a new consolidated plan including used oil, oil filters and containers and antifreeze for your organization on or before August 31, 2017.

Note that any notices to be provided to department officials pursuant to this approval shall be submitted in writing to: Christina McDonald, Chief Operating Officer, Green Manitoba, Manitoba Conservation and Water Stewardship, 160-123 Main Street, Winnipeg MB, R3C 1A5.

As we consult broadly on ways to further reduce waste in Manitoba, we will seek MARRC's advice on how to expand the opportunities for Manitobans to safely dispose of household hazardous wastes including the materials presently being collected by MARRC, particularly in northern and remote communities.

We look forward to our continued discussions and collaboration and I trust that this extension will allow MARRC to plan for further expansion into these communities. Thank you for providing an important environmental service to Manitobans.

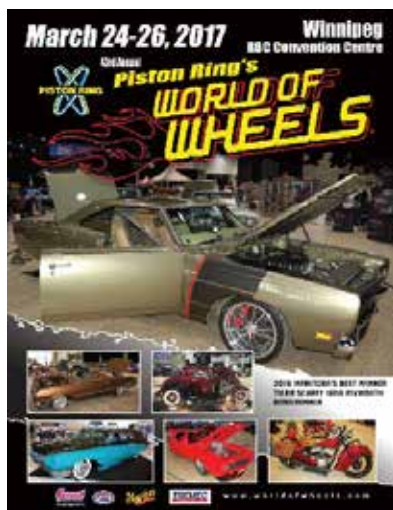

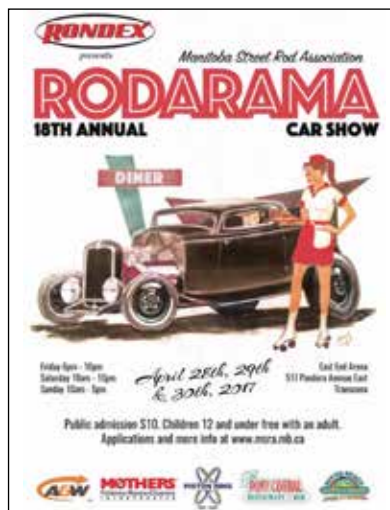

## Ambassador Program – Brochures Distributed

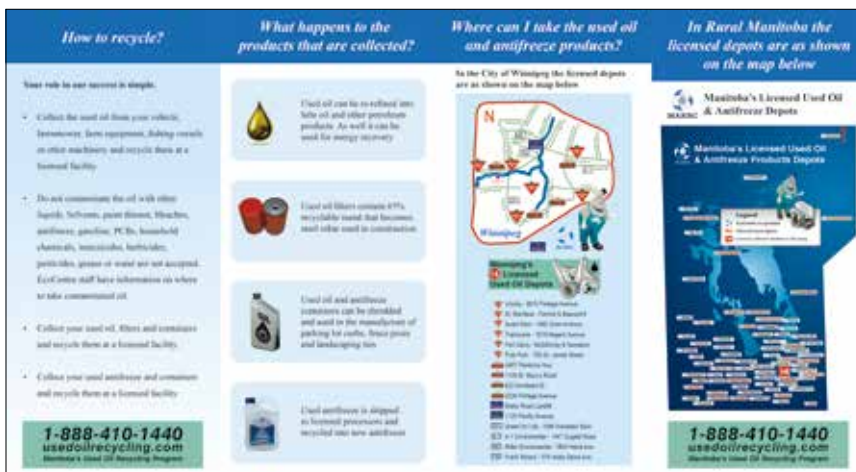

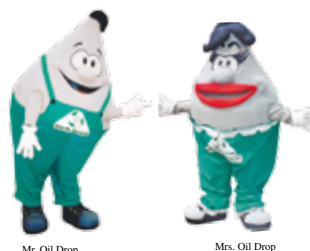

# Highlights of 2017

**MARRC Advertisies in the Whispering Pines Newsletter** - The Northern Association of Community Councils (NACC) publishes the Whispering Pines Newsletter three times a year, spring, summer and winter. Over 2000 copies are delivered throughout Manitoba to the NACC communities, Government Departments, First Nation Communities and Businesses.

## MARRC Participated with the Northern Association of Community Councils (NACC)

Their 47th Annual tradeshow was held at the Canad Inns Polo Park Hotel in Winnipeg on August 16th and 17th. The NACC represents the interests of 52 northern and remote communities under the jurisdiction of aboriginal leaders and northern affairs. Over 200 delegates from the northern communities federal and provincial affiliates, private sector and non-profit organizations attended.



## Bursaries awarded for a Fourteenth year

Bursaries were awarded to students (2 x \$500 each) qualifying in Environmental Studies at the University of Manitoba, University of Brandon, the University of Winnipeg and Red River Community College



## EcoCentre / Collection Depot network maturing at 100

MARRC's rural Licensed EcoCentre network stands at 83 exceeding the minimum network objective established by the province's multi stakeholder Used Oil Management Committee in 1996. The network includes the northern locations of Churchill, St. Theresa Point, The Pas, Flin Flon and Thompson, plus Cranberry Portage, Grand Rapids & Hollow Water. Monominto, Shoal Lake as well as Minnedosa were also established this year.

## City of Winnipeg

There are also 17 locations in Winnipeg 6 of which are Canadian Tire, 4 are Great Canadian Oil Change and 3 City of Winnipeg One-Stop-Shops now at the Brady Road Landfill, 1120 Pacific Avenue as well as a new location on 429 Panet Road at Mission.

## Training and audits promote safety and compliance

MARRC as part of its contractual arrangements with owners/operators of licensed collection facilities, provides initial and recurrent on-site training for management and staff. The training and follow-up audits are designed to promote a safe operation and compliance with each facility's operating license issued by Manitoba Conservation. During 2017, inspections were conducted at all of the licensed EcoCentres and collection depots in the Province of Manitoba.

## Strategic Planning Session (Aug 23-25)

BCUOMA hosted the combined Strategic Planning Session of AUOMA, SARRC, MARRC, SOGHU & Ontario Directors and Staff. The session focused on addressing key strategic issues and team building.

## Thompson (June 6)

MARRC presented in Thompson at the End of Life Vehicle and Scrap Metal Recycling Workshop.

## Manitoba Association of Regional Recyclers (MARR) Forum October 17

MARRC presented in 2 breakout sessions on Waste Management Action at the MARR Forum held on October 17 at the Best Western Plus Winnipeg Airport Hotel. MARRC had a booth set-up there as well. 172 delegates from Municipalities all across Manitoba were in attendance.



### Manitoba's Used Oil & Antifreeze Recycling Program:

- What funding is offered?**  
Assistance is offered for communities with their recycling efforts involving used oil, filters, containers and antifreeze. Communities interested in purchasing a Used Oil Recycling Unit, Manitoba's Used Oil & Antifreeze Recycling Program will support the capital investment to a maximum of (\$15,000 x 50%) \$7,500. They also provide 10% Capital Return on the community's initial investment each year for 10 years. (i.e. \$750) and will also pay \$0.02 per litre on the throughput volume of the used oil annually.
- What special training is required to operate the depot?**  
The operating license from Manitoba Conservation requires the depot staff to be effectively trained in procedures regarding the operation of the collection facility. Staff will also need to be certified under the Transportation of Dangerous Goods Regulation.
- What is the community responsible for?**  
\*Ensuring the site is licensed and approved.  
\*Purchasing a double-walled Underwriter's Laboratories of Canada licensed storage tank.  
\*Placing the storage tank on a pad along with coverage to protect from weather.  
\*Arranging the storage area to receive filters in a drum and containers in a bag.  
\*Staffing the facility.  
\*Facility layout.  
\*Insurance.  
\*Collecting all 4 streams: Used oil, antifreeze, used oil filters, used oil and antifreeze containers.

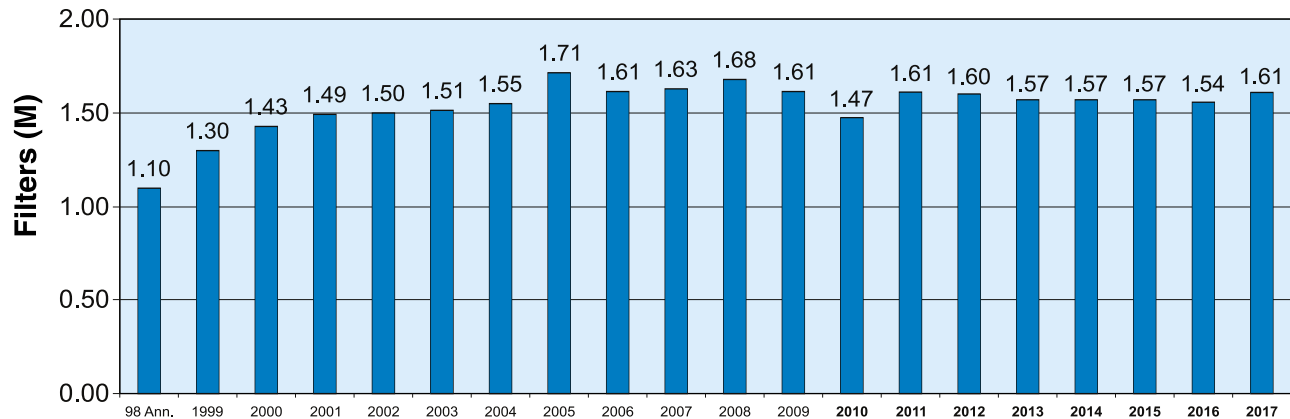

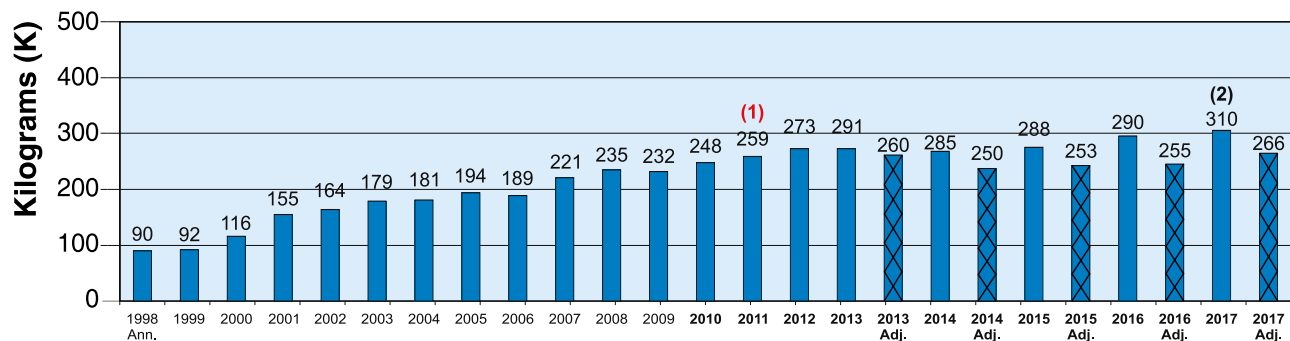

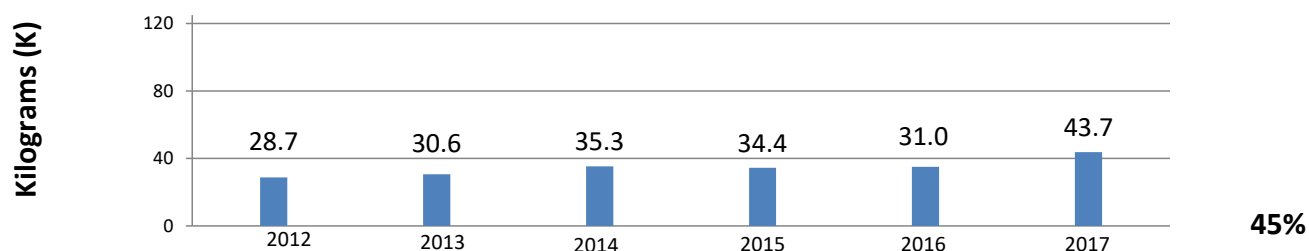


#### Antifreeze Fluid Recovery Review

Antifreeze collection in the Province and indeed throughout Canada has been relatively low while sales of Antifreeze fluid have been stable as confirmed in the EHC numbers. This brings up the question, where is the used product going? MARRC has initiated a study that will involve interviewing Collectors, Processors, Retailers, Big Box Stores, Commercial Accounts, Generators, Do-It-Yourselfers, etc. to determine the reason for the low recovery rates. Distinct early signs in the ongoing study is that a significant number of the purchases are for top-up ie. non-recoverable, which will result in a Lost in Service range of 80% rather than 55% leading to a recovery of approximately 60%.

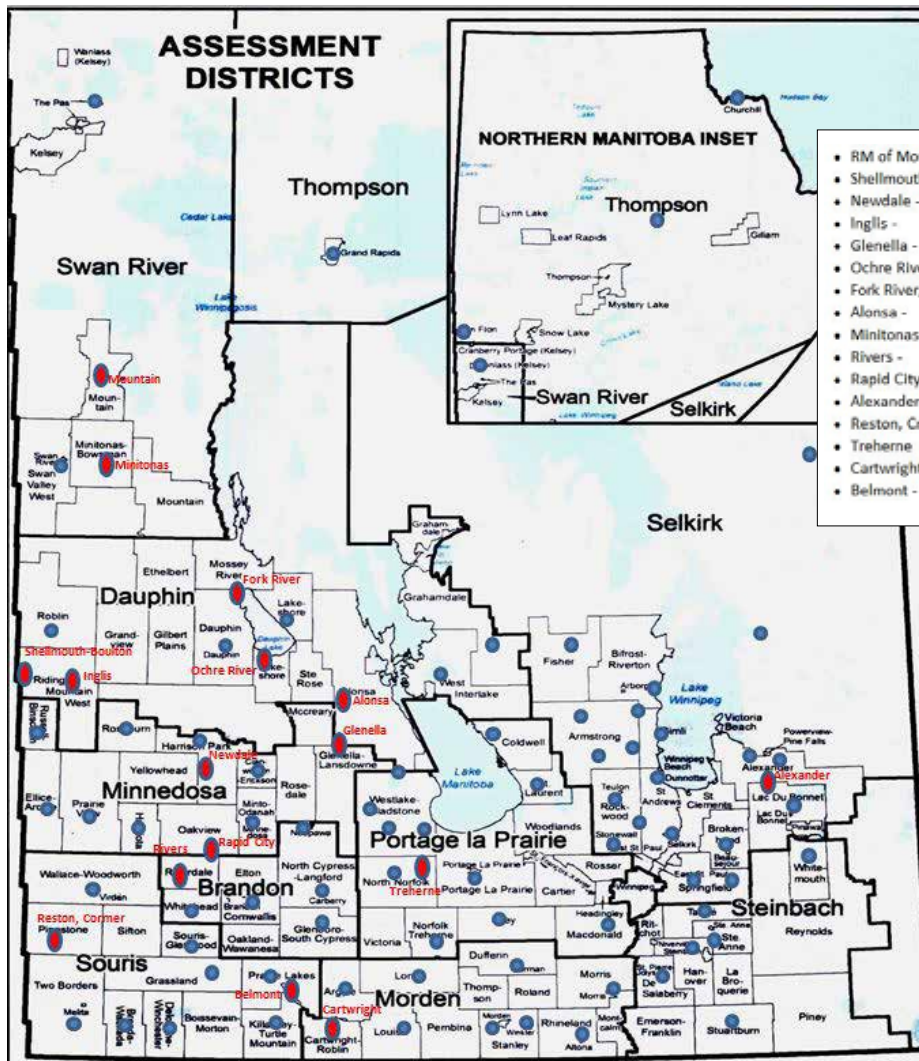

## Antifreeze Fluid Recovery Review

Antifreeze collection in the Province and indeed throughout Canada has been relatively low while sales of Antifreeze fluid have been stable as confirmed in the EHC numbers. This brings up the question, where is the used product going?

MARRC initiated a study that involved through a formal survey, gathering information from generators who have purchased antifreeze within the last 5 years and asked about their antifreeze recycling habits to determine the reason for the low recovery rates.

### Survey Results

Distinct early signs in the overall study is a significant number of the purchases are for “top-up” ie. non-recoverable, which will result in a Lost in Service range of 80% rather than 55% leading to a recovery of approximately 60%.

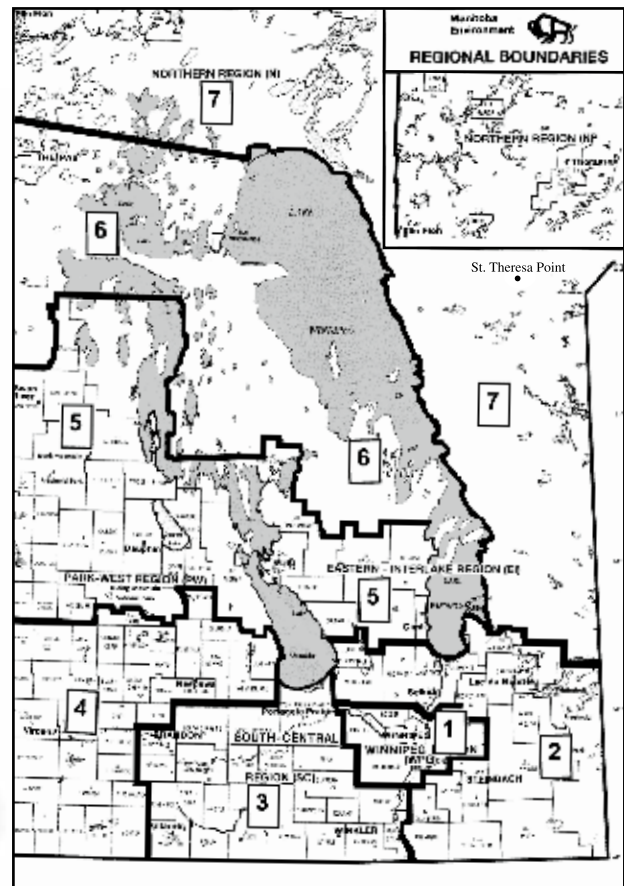

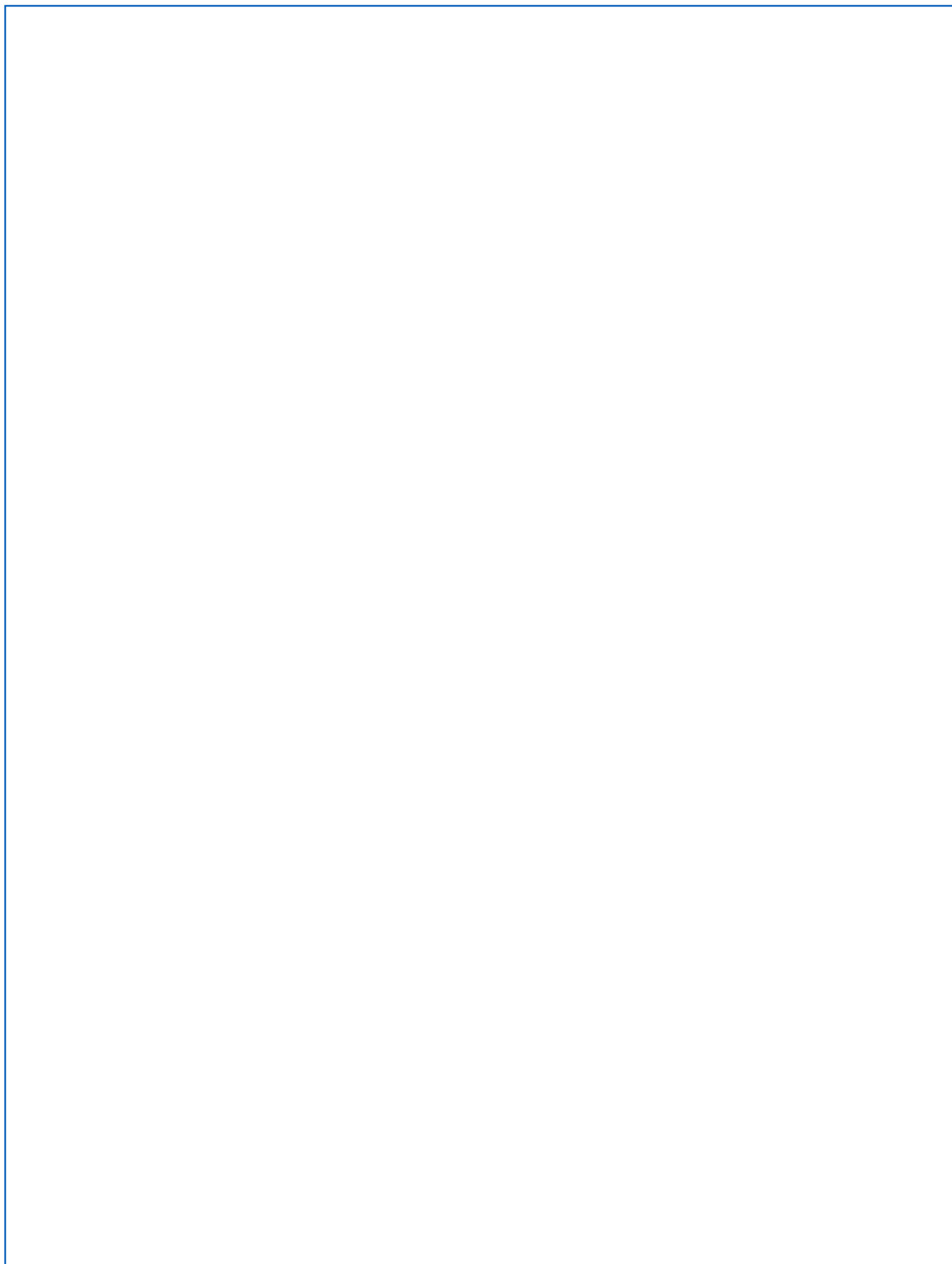
